- Ans. The poem "The height of the ridiculous" by Oliver Wendell Holmes, an American poet, is a funny poem. The poet wrote some lines while he was in a happy mood. While reading them he found them so funny, that he thought that he would actually die of laughing. Even though by nature he was a sober man, the lines were so funny that he was sure that people would appreciate them.

The central idea of the poem is an irony which talks about how too much of anything can have an adverse effect. On reading the poem, both its creator and its reader suffered in different ways due to the ridiculous nature of the poem. In short, it 'laughs' at the laugh that the direct characters had on reading the poem. The poem highlights the vanity of the poet when he declares that his composition is 'exceedingly good'. This is confirmed when the servant 'gets into a fit' after reading the poem. The poem is very simply created in narrative style, using humour as its soul.

This eight verse poem follows the rhyme scheme abcb dccc aaca. The Figures of speech that beautify the poem include Alliteration, Transferred Epithet, Tautology, Repetition, Simile, Hyperbole, Onomatopoeia, Inversion, and Synecdoche.

The author used lexical repetitions to emphasize a significant image; I is repeated. The poet used anaphora at the beginnings of some neighbouring lines. The same words they, the are repeated. The author used the same word he at the beginnings of some neighboring stanzas. The figure of speech is a kind of anaphora.

Rocket Man

Dr. K. Sivan, a humble farmer's son from Sarakkalvilai village in Tamil Nadu's Kanyakumari district, served as President of the Indian Space Research Organization (ISRO) and guided the Chandrayaan-2 lunar mission. In 2006, he graduated with a Ph.D in aerospace engineering from IIT Bombay made. His

childhood was very difficult. As a result, his brother and two sisters were unable to pursue an education. Only Dr. Sivan was the first graduate in his family. Dr. Sivan joined ISRO in 1982 and worked on almost all rocket programmes. Before assuming over as the Chairman of ISRO in January 2018, he served as the Director of the Vikram Sarabhai Space Centre (VSSC). He is known as 'Rocket Man' of ISRO.
